Respiratory Therapists

CAREER OVERVIEW

An aging population and a greater prevalence of respiratory conditions like asthma and COPD has made Respiratory Therapy one of the fastest-growing healthcare occupations. Respiratory Therapists, who specialize in treating and managing conditions that affect the lungs and breathing, are in high demand in the Cincinnati area.

HELPING PEOPLE BREATHE BETTER

For some people, breathing is not something they think about. But people with asthma, COPD, pneumonia, and cystic fibrosis know all too well how it feels to have difficulty breathing. A Respiratory Therapist helps people breathe better by:

- Administering oxygen therapy and aerosol medications
- Monitoring mechanical ventilators for people who can't breathe on their own
- Performing diagnostic lung function tests to assess lung function and breathing capacity.
- Providing emergency care, CPR, and airway management for people in respiratory distress

GETTING STARTED

Entry-level Respiratory Therapists typically have an Associates Degree from a 2-year program.

There is a high concentration of Radiologic Technologists and Technicians (Rad Techs) in the Cincinnati area, compared to other major cities, and overall employment is projected to grow 8.6% over the next few years. A career as a Rad Tech in Cincinnati is very promising.

RAD WORK, COOL TECHNOLOGY

Rad Techs work in medical and surgical hospitals, medical and diagnostic laboratories, physician offices, and outpatient care centers. They are the ones who perform diagnostic imaging like X-rays, fluoroscopy, portable radiography, and more.

A Rad Tech explains the process and positions you to get images of specific areas of the body. They operate the imaging equipment and ensure your safety during the procedure.

Rad Techs do not interpret or read the images, or provide a diagnosis. Their focus is getting highquality images.

A certificate or Associates Degree is required to become a Rad Tech.

CAREER OVERVIEW

An increasing demand for surgical procedures is creating a need for more Surgical Technicians. This fast-growing position provides great job stability and competitive starting wages.

WHAT A SURGICAL TECH DOES

Surgical Techs are also known as operating room techs. They play a crucial role before, during, and after a surgical procedure.

Before surgery, they prepare the operating room by setting up sterile instruments, equipment and supplies and ensuring all equipment is functioning properly.

During surgery, they will pass sterile instruments and supplies to the surgeon, assist with cutting sutures, and count sponges, needles, and other materials.

After surgery, they will apply dressings and bandages and make sure the operating room is clean and ready for the next procedure.

GETTING STARTED

You can earn an Associates Degree and become a Surgical Tech in as little as 2 years.

CAREER OVERVIEW

The majority of Medical and Clinical Laboratory Techs (Med Techs) work in either a hospital (50%) or in medical and diagnostic labs (23%).The job outlook is very positive.

WHAT A MED TECH DOES

Have you ever had blood drawn or given a urine sample at the doctor's office or hospital? A Med Tech is likely the person who collected the sample. They are also responsible for analyzing the results sent back by the lab.

Their work is important because it helps to: detect abnormalities, diseases, and other health issues early on; optimize patient outcomes; identify health issues before symptoms appear; and make informed decisions about diagnoses, treatment plans and patient care.

Their work is very detailed and methodical. They also are comfortable operating, calibrating, and maintaining the equipment used to run analyses.

GETTING STARTED

Due to the complexity and technical nature of the role, an Associate Degree is required to work as a Med Tech.

CAREER OVERVIEW

Licensed Practical Nurses are in high demand in the Greater Cincinnati region, where the population is aging and more and more people are needing more frequent hands-on care.

About one-third of LPNs work in nursing homes and residential care facilities; the remainder work in a wide variety of healthcare facilities including hospitals, physician offices, outpatient care centers and more.

THE EYES AND EARS OF THE TEAM

Some patients, especially the elderly, require daily hands-on care and assistance. This is the crucial role of the LPN: continuous care and monitoring of patients and reporting information back to the care team. They also:

- Monitor a patient's vital signs like blood pressure and pulse and overall health condition
- Change bandages, insert catheters
- Administer medications and injections
- Assist with medical tests and procedures
- Consult with RNs to develop patient care plans

GETTING STARTED

A 3-semester certificate is typically required to become an LPN.

The job outlook for Nursing Assistants (also known as CNAs, STNAs, and PCAs) is very strong in Greater Cincinnati. There are thousands of open positions and demand is expected to grow in the next few years.

DAY-TO-DAY PATIENT CARE

For many patients, Nursing Assistants are an important part of their daily lives, helping them do necessary things they can't do for themselves like eating, bathing, dressing, or basic grooming.

Nursing Assistants work in skilled nursing facilities, hospitals, long-term care and assisted living communities, home health care services, and more. Additional duties include:

- Monitoring and recording patients' vital signs
- Documenting food and liquid intake
- Transporting patients and helping with other mobility needs
